

I am amazed at the way India responded to 26/11. Like cowards the terrorists pounced on the weak, the unarmed and the old and killed without regret. But although blood flowed through the corridors of the Taj and onto the streets of Mumbai, although life came to a standstill all over this great city for two days -they did not succeed because at every corner they came face to face with the brave soldiers of India-noble selfless commandos who were willing to lay down their lives to save those who were held. They did not succeed because the staff of the Taj and the Oberoi, ordinary people doing ordinary jobs walked that extra mile, beyond the call of duty, to protect those who had come as guests. They did not succeed because we did not give in to hate, we did not allow ourselves to be divided, we did not break out into violence.

We watched the wounded being taken out, we witnessed the hungry flames licking the windows of the stately building, we housed the men who fought this evil and we prayed for those who lost their loved ones. Our students were in shock - frightened, disturbed and in need of counselling. We got the Academy of Life to come in. With these professionals, the students were given the chance to confront their emotions, whether of anger, frustration, revenge, sorrow or pain. Also, two doctors from Israel along with Dr. Maya Kriplani from Bombay Hospital visited our school and held Workshops on anger management. The students were allowed to talk about their feelings, accept their emotions and were taught to love themselves exactly as they were. That they were on the road to recovery was evident from the interviews they later gave to CNN-IBN.

The commandos who stayed in our school, spoke this to me as they bid us farewell, "Father, the most precious gift we can give our children is to educate them with the right values. It is this that can prevent violence". One thing that crisis does is to give us the ability to reach out and touch lives. The Interact Club of the School paid a visit to the injured police officers at Bombay Hospital, J. J. Hospital carrying with them gifts of flowers, bedsheets and Get well cards. The bravery of these men in the face of terror was an inspiration to our students.

As the year ended, it was Christmas and in keeping with Christ's message to share and care, we visited Ashadhaan, Old Age homes, orphanages and the homes of poor students. Everywhere we took the spirit of Christmas with us, distributing gift hampers, and with it, a far more precious gift - love.

I have been here for the last six months. It has been a pleasure to work with and for all of you. The responsibility is huge but it is the smiling faces of students that make it all worthwhile.


Children's Day this year was filled with surprises
